Putting Content into Structure

This outline is designed to help you write a research paper. In your thesis statement, you must let the reader know the main focus of your essay. You will express an opinion as to what you believe about your research topic. Both of these objectives must appear in your thesis.

How to proceed:

1. On separate paper draft a rough draft of everything you can think of regarding your research topic to date.
2. Use the form below to outline your rough draft to isolate what is important to your essay.

Your Introduction

Drafting a working thesis statement:

Remember that your thesis statement must tell the reader what your topic is, what your focus will be, and why it is important. Your thesis statement is the most important sentence of your paper and therefore must be clear and concise, yet thorough.
